In stories character can feel lots of emotions, just like we do in real life.



How many different emotions can you think of? Make a spider diagram or list of all of your ideas. Try and use our exciting vocabulary. Not just sad and happy ...

Task


On the next page you will see images from the story Supertato. How do you think the characters in the illustrations feel? Why do they feel like that?



We have looked at a number of 2D shapes and their properties.


2D Shape Word Mat








We have looked at straight sides, curved sides and vertices (corners).

Remember a curved side is like a circle and a straight side can be vertical, horizontal or diagonal.




What is the same and what is different?


