E.g. First, I got out of bed. Next, I put my school clothes on. Finally, I had my breakfast.


## To use time vocabulary (dates)

Talking time:
What are the days of the week? Let's practise chanting them.

What day is it today? (the day it is now)
What day was it yesterday? (the day before)
What day is it tomorrow? (the next day)

## To use time vocabulary (dates)

Talking time:
If today is Thursday, tomorrow is $\qquad$
If today is Sunday, yesterday was $\qquad$
If yesterday was Wednesday, today it is $\qquad$
*This concept can be very difficult for children to process visually. It is important that they can see the days displayed in front of them so they can practise jumping forwards and backwards. Spend time exploring the days using the language 'yesterday, today, tomorrow'.
