



Maths: To explore volume and capacity.


Today we are beginning to look at volume and capacity. <u>Volume</u> is how much liquid is in a container.

- half empty?


You can use the sink, washing up bowl or bath to complete this task. I would suggest using a clear container like a jug, cup, water bottle or even food container.




Computing: To type my name.


